### Words from our Principal on the job – Brett Speed

#### Playground:

The demolition of the playground near the F-2 (BER building) will begin today, with the installation of the new equipment starting in

the next few days. This will mean that the playground will be out of bounds for the next 5-6 school days.



Students will still have access to the oval at this stage. Parents will need to park along Harley Street if dropping students off, as the car park area is blocked off.

#### Works update:

There has been a lot of work on the roof and gutters of both the F-2 (BER) and the Main office building in the last few weeks.

The OHSC building has brand new double doors installed, with a new asphalt area and improved drainage.

Works will continue over the coming weeks including the flooring in the library.

The **OSHC** will operate in the Junior Learning **Centre** (Foundation-Year 2 building) before and after school as a result. Please contact Faith or Emily if you wish to discuss this further.

#### **Working Bee:**

#### Homework:

The Year 3-6 teachers are sending home the following communication re: homework today. Students will be required to complete the following tasks every week:

Read for a minimum of 15 minutes every day, or finish their book.

We have included some reading comprehension questions for parents or carers to ask before, during, and after reading.

- Spelling words based on individual need. These could include irregular words, decodable words, or root words.
- Unfinished classwork

On occasion, the following tasks will be sent home:

- Mathletics
- Reading Eggs
- My Numeracy and My Literacy (Essential Assessment)

If these activities cannot be completed at home, they can be completed from 8.45am -9am before formal classes start.




**Activities:** Students have been busy with their hands on learning experiences at Carrington this week.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.


If you have a valid means-tested concession card.
