What: Therapeutic program for students in grade 6 who need extra support with social skills, self-esteem, managing strong feelings and developing resilience.




Senior School Snapshot

In **Writing**, students covered a short recap of persuasive writing techniques. Students learnt about the power of the persuasive structure to capture and convince their audience. 'Hey Ant' by Hannah and Phillip Hoose.



In **Reading**, explicit lessons have been based around comprehension skills. Students learnt about the different categories of questions often asked, then learnt and trialled these skills. Often, we think we know the answer, but it's always best to prove the answer by checking the text! Students also explored the best strategies for answering multiple choice questions in readiness for the upcoming NAPLAN assessments.

In **Mathematics**, students have been exploring measurement and geometry concepts this past fortnight. How to accurately measure using appropriate units, how to calculate area and how to classify angles were just some of the concepts covered! Students have also undertaken pre-assessment on our up-coming unit on operations!



Homework has continued this fortnight in the senior school. Homework goes home Monday and be marked the following Friday. The purpose of our homework consists of a few important benefits; positive consolidation of classroom learning, establishment of sound study habits, encouraging students to develop responsibility for their learning and organisation and extending communication between home and school about skills being developed in class.




SPECIALIST - STREAM

SENIOR

In STREAM, senior students have enjoyed exploring our Solar System. We have looked at the different moon phases when it travels around the sun and what planets are in it.

This has stirred up some discussion if Pluto is still considered one of our planets. Students are beginning the process of creating a video demonstrating their understanding of the Solar System with Spheros and construction materials.









JUNIOR



In STREAM, we have enjoyed looking deeper into the materials that build the world we live in. Students have explored how materials bend and stretch and how they change whether it be permanent or short lived. The students have been able to categorise the different types of

changes and identify which materials suit bending and stretching. Students have shown great excitement in using their knowledge to bend and stretch different materials to create towers and road blocks for our BlueBots to manoeuvre around.











Physical Education (PE)

F-1

This fortnight in Physical Education Foundation and year one students have been exploring the fundamental movement skill kicking. Using a balloon and a marking cone students practised this skill before playing a game in pairs called balloon kicks, where one person kicks the balloon as far as they can and makes as many runs as they can to the next marking cone and back before the fielder returns the balloon to the original marking cone.

Year 2-3

Year two and three students have been focusing on movement challenges playing a game called "Fruit Salad with a Twist". This is where students listen to the movement command first (which could be walking backwards, crab walking, bear crawling, hopping etc.) then for which groups turn it is to traverse to the other side of the playing field and back. It definitely tested our coordination and bilateral movement.

Year 4,5 and 6

Year Four, Five and Six students have started brushing up on our sporting skills for interschool sport. There are three different sports to choose from and this week we focused on refining our soccer skills. We spent time in pairs and small groups working on our dribble kicking and attacking the ball. We then put these skills into practise with a game of number soccer.

TRIBES



In Tribes this fortnight we explored the idea of 'happy places.' This centred around sharing the things we liked and finding similarities between students. Each tribe used this discussion as a springboard to create

their own island, full of things they love and enjoy to surround themselves with. This was an

excellent opportunity for collaboration and building relationships as students worked together across all grades and different skill levels!
