# Student reporting and Parent/Teacher conferences:



# **Robotics workshops:**

Our senior students participated in the Robokids workshops this week. Students were actively engaged in the session using iPads to code the movement of each robot. These sessions will build







student knowledge around digital technology and allow them to explore and engage with technology prior to our STREAM program commencing in Term 3.



At the end of the day classroom teachers also engaged with the Robokids instructors for a professional learning session. This provided them with targeted and detailed learning to support the implementation of our own robotics program.
