




Senior School Snapshot

In **Writing**, students have completed their exploration of non-fiction texts, including information reports and brochures. Starting from week 7, students will shift their focus to procedural texts. They have already written one procedural text, evaluated it using a rubric, and set goals for improvement. Together, we have delved into the importance of precise verbs, synonyms, and the use of adverbs to enhance verb descriptions. In the upcoming weeks, students will further develop these skills.





In **Reading** as we approach the conclusion of our novel study on "Boy Overboard," we are thrilled by the level of engagement and involvement shown by our students. Throughout this journey, we have explored character studies, delving into the intricate emotions and motivations of the protagonists Jamal, Bibi and (new character) Radhida. Human rights themes have sparked meaningful discussions, allowing us to draw connections between the story and real-world issues. With the final chapters in sight, we eagerly anticipate the

continued development of our students' understanding and appreciation for this remarkable book.

In **Mathematics**, we have begun our unit on time. We started by having students create their own Swatches and matching clocks, which they have been using to improve their accuracy in time-telling. We also explored how tv guides utilise time and duration to convey information. As we progress, students will continue to develop their understanding of time incidentally, taking advantage of everyday opportunities to practice time-telling skills throughout their school years.



In **Integrated Studies** this fortnight, we have focused on government and the exploration of rules and laws. The students have been actively engaged in thought-



provoking discussions, examining the distinctions between rules and laws. They have delved into the intriguing process of how bills can shape and alter laws, providing a deeper understanding of the legislative procedures.

Last Friday saw our first **Spirit Day!** We would like to thank our all our families how helped my the day so wonderful with their! More Spirit Days will be occurring each term, so be sure to keep your eyes peeled for announcements!

This Friday, we were proud to witness many of our senior students representing Carrington Primary at the **District Basketball** competition.
