




Senior School Snapshot

In **Writing** this fortnight, lessons were focused around real world activities of cooking and creating with students constructing procedural pieces to accompany them. Students made fairy bread, pizza and origami pieces exploring how the different procedural texts required different elements. This was a highly enjoyable and engaging unit. Students explored how adverbs are important in telling how to do a verb and how precise instructions can make a big difference.



In **Reading**, students finished and reflected on our term novel study. 'Boy Overboard'. It was definitely a highlight of the term. We were proud of the students' maturity and



comprehension skills taken to discuss and analyse the characters' complex journeys and personalities. We were also fortunate

enough to participate in Book Bash hosted by the State Library of Victoria. Through this program we had authors Matt Cosgrove, Eva Amores and Andy Griffiths present to the students via Zoom. The authors shared their stories and some tips and tricks that can help us to become better writers!



In **Mathematics**, our students have explored money and decimals, and developed their



understanding of area. Students then applied this learning to problem solving activities. Students have learned how to calculate the area of both regular and composite quadrilaterals. For composite quadrilaterals, many students worked out quickly that if they break

quadrilaterals, many students worked out quickly that if they break the shape into regular quadrilaterals (squares and rectangles), they will be able to find the area quickly. Finally, students applied their learning to a range of problem solving activities, linking their understanding with the problem solving strategies they have learned

throughout the year. Students also learnt the history of our Austalian bank notes and how to calculate and give the correct change for purchases under \$50.

In **Integrated Studies** this fortnight, students finished their unit on government, rules and laws. The classes held mock election campaigns for what they believe should be the next Spirit Day at Carrington Primary School. To enable this, students created posters and speeches that were presented to their class. Following all the speeches, students voted in a secret ballot using preferential voting, mimicking the Australian electoral process. These votes will now be sent to the Junior School Council for their input.





STRFAM

5/6

Students have continued to investigate electric circuits through the lens of light. They have explored how light can be classified as transparent, translucent, and opaque. Students

have continued to use the design process to test various solutions and change where deemed necessary.

4/5

In STREAM, students have continued to explore how forces work on different objects. These can be seen



and some are invisible. They have explored these forces through various resources including: Lego, Edison and Knex. Students have enjoyed experimenting different solutions to test different forces using the desing process and adjusting their solution if needed.

2/3



Students have continued their study of forces including; push and pull. They have used BlueBots and Edisons to experiment how the force is exerted. This has been through the use of the design process to explore how they can create

different solutions. Students

followed up the creation by

analysing and imprementing adjustments if necessary.



In STREAM, students have explored using BlueBots and

Edisons the exertion of forces. They have used the design process to create various solutions based on the challenge posed. Students enjoyed testing different solutions and discussing how they could implement a change to improve it for next time.
