
FATHER'S DAY BREAKFAST:

Senior Snapshot




The last two weeks have continued to be jammed packed for the senior students. The grade 6 students have been operating their canteen every Tuesday and Thursday at recess time. Last Friday, we attended the Knox Athletics Track for District Athletics where every student had an opportunity to represent our school. Despite the weather, the day was fabulous and the students were amazing. It was so wonderful to see the students working so hard to achieve



their personal best. On Monday, the students had the opportunity to have breakfast at school for Father's Day, as well as participate in a joint activity in their classrooms. We were also lucky enough to have a visit from Charlotte Hodgson, a



hockey player from the VIS. Tuesday we then started our rugby clinics with Mr Michalowsky and on Thursday we had an opportunity to purchase gifts from the Father's Day stall.

In *Writing*, students have been exploring narrative texts, the use of quotation marks and various forms of poetry. They have looked at both structural and language features of these text types. Grade 4/5M have also been working on our joined writing so that we can earn our pen licence.



In *Maths*, we have been exploring concepts related to money and finance. The students have been adding and subtracting money, using budgets, calculating change and exploring percentages. Stay tuned for some special announcements from the grade 6 students.



In **Integrated Studies**, we have continued to explore aspects of democracy and government. They have looked at the different levels of government and what these levels are responsible for. In our **Science** component the grade 4s and 5s have continued to look at the importance of food packaging and how we can reduce our impact on the environment. The grade 6s have continued to explore different states of matter and conducted experiments to observe changes. This week we have also incorporated various activities to help us celebrate Father's Day.










- Grade 6: Students have continued exploring the design process by constructing bridges from various materials. They examined which shapes provide the greatest strength and stability, learning how to incorporate these into their designs. Students collaborated effectively in pairs, sharing ideas and strategies to enhance their projects.
- Grades 4 and 5: Students explored the world of coding by integrating building and programming skills. They designed and built chariots using K'nex to attach to Spheros, then programmed their vehicles to navigate specific tasks, combining creativity with technical skills.
- Grades 2 and 3: Students kept working with Spheros, creating their own maps to program the robots to move around. They experimented with different coding blocks to develop more complex movements and problem-solving strategies.
- Prep and Grade 1: Students enjoyed exploring mapping and navigation with Bluebots. They built their own maps, including essential survival elements such as shelter, food, and entertainment, then used Bluebots to travel around their islands, reinforcing spatial awareness and coding skills.
