## Senior Snapshot




Welcome back to Term 4. Again we have had so many events and opportunities for the students to participate in. Topped off by today's Rugby Gala Day. We are extremely proud of the students' resilience with many timetable changes, new students to support and the weather making last minute changes inevitable.



In *Reading*, we have started our new novel study, *Spirit of the Crocodile* by Aaron Fa'aoso and Michelle Scott Tucker. We are really lucky to have a former Carrington teacher, Lyn White, as the editor and creator of this project.



The blurb is: Twelve-year-old Ezra is an ordinary boy who lives on Saibai, an extraordinary Australian island. He loves a laugh, he loves his family, and - almost more than anything - he loves a dare.



But when one of his dares goes wrong, Ezra realises he needs to make some decisions about helping out and measuring

up. He learns that there's more than one way to look at, well, nearly everything.



And as ever-increasing climate disasters threaten Saibai, Ezra and his best mate Mason must draw on their resilience and courage to help the community survive a massive out-of-season storm.

Set in today's Torres Strait, *Spirit of the Crocodile* is a captivating novel that explores the importance of culture, community and place to a carefree kid on the cusp of growing up.



In *Writing*, we have been looking at the various aspects of Information Reports. These include diagrams, captions, subtitles and titles. The students have been looking at how to summarise information to help write their own pieces.

In *Maths*, the students have been exploring various aspects of location. They have been using coordinates to find and locate various objects, locating grid references and drawing pictures by

following the grid locations. During our mass unit, the students were reading weights using different scales, converting masses from milligrams, grams, kilograms and tonnes. The grade 4s and 5s also used different ways to compare, read and match temperatures.



In **Integrated Studies**, the students have been exploring geography. The grades have been looking at Australia as part of the Southern Hemisphere, Australian landmarks and the oceans and seas surrounding.



In **Science**, the grade 4s and 5s have been exploring life cycles. We have looked at mammals, amphibians and insects. This week we learned that some insects have a four step lifecycle (including metamorphosis) and some only have a three step cycle (no



metamorphosis). The grade 6s have been exploring animal adaptations. They have been investigating the different types of adaptations.
