Wow, we have been so busy over the last 2 weeks with lots of learning and celebrations. The 100th day celebration was filled with photos, counting, balloons and treats. To finish off our fortnight, we were able to compete in our tribe colours for our school athletics day. Senior School Snapshot

Over the past couple of weeks we have stayed busy with robotics, learning to understand and control our spheros through obstacle courses, and working well with the equipment. Students have also been busy preparing for athletics day, and getting into their team spirit! School leaders have continued to show their leadership through facilitating and actively being involved in the running of Tribes, school assembly, and Junior school council.



Literacy

In Literacy, senior students have been reading, analysing, and creating poems! Students have created cinquains, limericks, odes and haikus over the past two weeks. Through these different styles of poetry students have learnt about sentence structure and rhythm, as well as deepening



their understanding of verbs, adjectives, nouns, metaphor, simile, and personification. It has been a lot of fun looking at the connection between poetry and songs, stories, and jokes.



Numeracy

In Numeracy, senior students have extended on from the money unit, into fractions, decimals, and percentages. We have looked at real-world problems involving money, where addition or subtraction are used. For some students this involved recognising, counting, ordering, and adding small numbers of Australian coins. For others, this involved adding or subtracting decimal amounts (e.g. \$1.25 + \$2.60), or working out the fraction or percentage of a given amount, to find the sale price of an item (e.g. A \$50 jacket was on sale for 20% off, how much money am I saving?). Students have used a range of materials and activities to explore these topics, with a focus on how they can be applied in life outside of school.
