

Physical Education

This fortnight in Physical Education Junior School students practiced fundamental movement skill kicking a ball. We practised kicking the ball to a cone, kicking the ball to a partner, and kicking the ball in a hoop. We continued to learn our port from starboard (left and right) in a game called "Ship Shack Shore" and we learnt to follow movement sequences in order including "Walk the plank" "Row your boat" and "Shark in the water".

Senior School Snapshot

Senior students have had another great couple of weeks, with some students competing in district athletics, another student lead TRIBES session, Book Week, as well as our introduction to our Design and Technologies unit with the viewing of the documentary 2040.

Literacy

In Literacy, senior students have come back to poems, looking at and engaging in the skills needed to analyse texts. We have continued to use and work with MSL sound cards to help students' understandings of letter-sound relationships, for both reading and writing skills. We have been breaking down the different parts of a sentence, including subjects, verbs, punctuation and capitalisation. We have had specific focus on verbs and ensuring an understanding of past, present, and future tense in writing. Some students also got creative in exploring the book 'Tops and Bottoms' by illustrating, and using windows to trace drawings to add to their work.









Numeracy

In Numeracy, senior students have been working on multiplication and division. We have been using lots of physical materials to show workings and engage all learners. Some students have been focused on using counters and other materials to show repeated addition, equal shares, and linking these using multiplication and division sentences. Other students have been extending their understandings of multiplication and division

through a range of learning games, as well as using MAB blocks or counters to show written multiplication methods, and division with remainders.

Inquiry

Senior students have engaged in our Designed Solutions unit through the initial watching of Australian documentary 2040, or The Tomorrow Book by Jackie French. Both texts look at some problems we might face, and possible ideas for solutions to these problems. Students have been engaging in some fantastic conversations about these topics, and will begin independent investigations next week.



Art

This fortnight in Visual Arts students continued constructing their buildings and amenities for our collaborative collage project "Box City". Students continued to decorate recycled boxes to resemble buildings and city amenities. We also worked on our road map of our towns adding collage paper to resemble grass, asphalt, and footpaths.

PΕ

In Physical Education students continued to practice their volleyball skills. Students learnt to block the ball, dig the ball, spike the ball and two different ways to serve the ball. First, we practised our skills with a partner then we had a practise match. We also learnt a new game "Tennis ball relay" to test our agility. In teams we raced to see which team could place all the tennis balls on top of the marking cones without knocking any over. It was quite a challenging and fun race.
