We have reached the end of another term. It has been a tremendous effort by all the students with learning. They have really focused on trying their hardest and applying all of their skills to the tasks at hand. We celebrated R U OK Day last week. It was great to see so much yellow in the classroom. 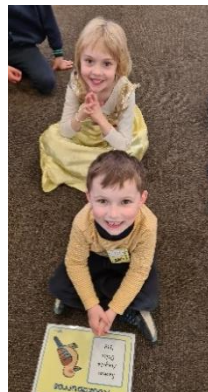

Visual Arts

This fortnight in Visual Arts Junior School students created an out of space collage poster. We started by splattering paint and using large brushstrokes to create our background. Then we



created planets, rockets, aliens, stars, and black holes and pasted these onto our poster. Some of us chose to add some gold sparkles. Our space posters are out of this world!

Physical Education

This fortnight in Physical Education Junior School students played games to build our fundamental movement skills in Running. We played "What's the time Mr Wolf" and "Fruit salad". These games involve lots of running and waiting for our turn to run. We continued to work on our agility in a game called "Ship Shack Shore". We learnt to follow some new movement sequences in order including "Climb the ladder" and "Bury the treasure".

Senior School Snapshot

It has been such a busy and exciting end to Term 3 in Senior school. Between Athletics, Interschool Sport and Footy Colours Day and RoboKids there has been a range of enjoyable activities for students.

Literacy

In reading, students have been critiquing and analysing poems and other texts. In our critiques we also made book reviews and recommendations for other students within the school. In writing we have explored persuasive writing again. We explored a range of persuasive devices and applied them in short pieces.



Numeracy

In the last two weeks students have explored algorithms in a range of situations. Students learned to apply their knowledge of algorithms to all four mathematical operations. Students also applied their knowledge to real life situations. Students also revisited the topics of chance and probability. They were able to explore the topic through the use of chance games and experiments.

Integrated Studies

The last two weeks have seen students develop their sustainable solutions for a range of food related issues. Students explored issues that we face with food production, linking with the learning from the 2040 documentary we watched this term. Students had to design a solution and then come up with the impact of that solution, including both positives and negatives.



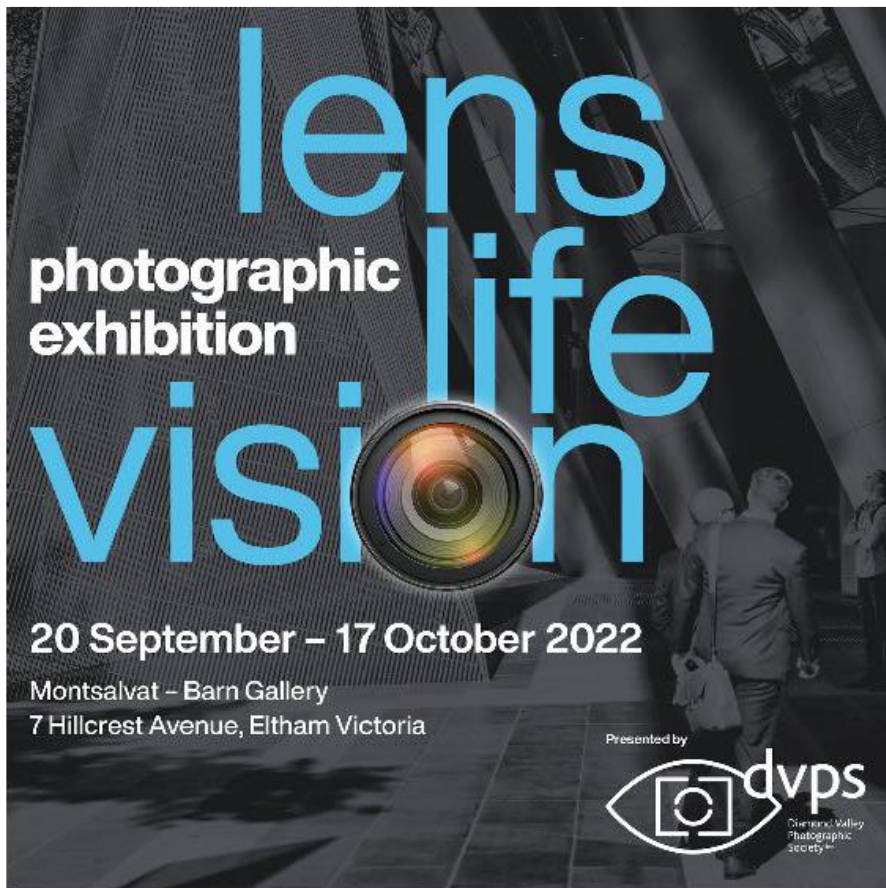
Visual Arts

This fortnight in Visual Arts Senior School students finished constructing our collaborative collage project "Box City". Students added extra embellishments including trees, pathways driveways and footpaths. We are all so proud of our creativity and efforts.



Physical Education

This fortnight in Physical Education Senior School Students continued to refine their volleyball skills. Year 5 and 6 students participated in an interschool sport competition competing in a round robin of Volleyball games. In week ten Senior students played lots of games including knockout, down ball, fruit salad, tennis ball relay and survivor. These games help to strengthen and refine our motor skills, agility, and hand eye coordination. It was lovely to see such wonderful teamwork and hear the encouraging cheers from each team.
