

Visual Arts

This fortnight in Visual Arts Junior School students created wearable art pieces inspired by the works of Indigenous artist Lola Greeno. Students threaded a variety of materials including straws, cardboard beads, pasta beads and patty pans creating colourful unique necklaces and bracelets.

Physical Education

This fortnight in Physical Education Junior School students participated in a soccer clinic. Students practised skills including dribbling, passing, goal shooting and played a game called "Foxes and Rabbits". The following week we continued to build on our skills by playing kicking relays and "Number Soccer".

Senior School Snapshot



We have had a busy start to Term 4, with student First Aid training, a soccer clinic, Edison robots in STREAM, as well as Canine Comprehension for the year 5 & 6's. There has also been lots of background work done by the Junior School Council members and school leaders, working toward lots of exciting things around the corner!



Literacy

In Literacy, senior students have been looking at the elements of a story, summarising a story, and started Author studies, beginning with the works of Dr. Seuss. Students have examined several of his works, looking at the literary devices used in the wonderful world of Dr. Seuss' imaginative storytelling. This was followed by an inquiry-based project, where students researched, drafted, and published an information report about Dr. Seuss' life and works.



Numeracy

In Numeracy, senior students have been focusing on probability and data representation. We have had a lot of fun playing chance games and discussing the probability of different outcomes. After exploring, discussing, and experimenting with chance, students created their own chance experiments. They designed, found the probability of different outcomes, performed their experiments, and presented the data in pie charts using google docs. Students compared the difference between the probable outcomes and the results of their experiments, including comparison line charts for some students.







Visual Arts

This fortnight in Visual Arts Senior School students created wearable art pieces inspired by Indigenous artist Lola Greeno. Lola Greeno collects shells from the beach and processes them to make elaborate shell necklaces. Students explored threading and used glass beads and straws creating wearable artworks including, headrests necklaces and bracelets.

Physical Education

This fortnight in Physical Education Senior School Students participated in a soccer clinic. We started with a jogging warm up and practised our kicking and passing skills. We then played games including called "Foxes and Rabbits" and built upon our teamwork skills in several great games of "Number Soccer". The following week we continued to practise our dribbling, passing, and kicking skills by participating in games of "Number Soccer".
