WORKS UPDATE:



The hall is looking really good on the interior, with the storeroom, bathrooms and carpet all finalised. The cladding on the front of the building creates a lovely new entry way, which we will be able to use at the beginning of 2023 once final inspections are conducted. Our demolition area will remain fenced off for a while with project planning underway for the area.



Our school has successfully gained a funding grant to create a sensory garden space for our students to access, with a landscape architect sourced to design the area. The space will develop over the next 12 months.

Finally our shade sail has been installed outside the Junior building on the oval side. This will create another outdoor/flexible learning space for our students and staff to use in the warmer months.


