NAPLAN online practice:

CPS completed the first online session for our Year 5 students last week successfully, using the iPads to log in and have a go at using the new platform. Students in Year 3 and Year 5 will have the opportunity to work through the OMNIBUS test, which has parts of reading, writing, maths and language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) within. This is the first time that technology will be used to complete the NAPLAN assessments, with the official testing window open from the 10th-20th May this year.

Inter-school sport:

Xavier, our Sport Captain, provided the following report from a very successful outing at Fairhills Secondary last Friday. The students thoroughly enjoyed the day.

Speech Therapy Tip 5 Fortnightly language tips for the home

<u>Describe</u> your everyday activities out loud to your child. While in the supermarket, point out the vegetable and name it. **Explain** what you are doing while cooking a meal. **Point out objects**

around the house when you are cleaning it. Make your explanations simple and include appropriate



grammar and **information** (e.g. "I'm chopping the tomatoes into halves"). If you can, try and **get down to the level** of your child to improve the sentence model.

The Junior School Snapshot

Wow, there have been so many exciting opportunities for the junior students over the last two weeks. The students have participated in the AFL clinics during school time as well as the opportunity to do so afterschool. The Foundation students have continued to develop their relationships with their buddies while the grade 1s and 2s have become more confident working on Mathletics independently. Miss Colla and Mrs Marsden are very proud of the independence the students are displaying especially when they are organising their own belongings between the classrooms. We are also loving the effort the students are putting in to learn their irregular words and reading their books at home.

Here are some highlights from our classroom:

Literacy

- Letters introduced r and c
- Irregular words glitter trays and playdough
- Narrative texts setting, characters, beginning, middle and end, pre-assessment task
- Decodable Rules voiced an unvoiced 'th' words and 'wh' words









Numeracy

- Using ten frames to show place value
- 2D shapes names, difference between 2D and 3D shapes, sides/edges and vertices
- Counting patterns 2s, 5s and 10s starting at many different starting points and going forwards or backwards

Integrated Studies

- Life Education Van Pre-visit booklet
- Harmony Day
- Changing Materials cooked and uncooked pasta
- Respectful relationships kindness and bravery
- Buddies completing our buddies' poster, similarities, and differences









Specialists

- Art This week in Visual Art students continued to explore mixing secondary colours, shades and tints. Using this knowledge to continue working on their mixed-up chameleon.
- P.E. This week in Physical Education students have been perfecting their throwing and catching skills, with a particular focus on overarm throwing. Students demonstrated their skills in a game called

"Fill the Hoop" where students work in teams to fill hula hoops with as many bean bags as they can.

Senior School Snapshot

At Carrington Primary we celebrated Harmony Week with a range of activities celebrating diversity. This included a collaborative display of student portraits to celebrate this year's Harmony Week theme 'We All Belong'.

Students also participated in an AFL clinic run by AFL Victoria, with another to run this week.



Literacy

In literacy we have been extending reading comprehension through looking at how different features help us understand the texts we are reading. We have also been creating narrative texts through planning, writing, and editing our own stories. This has included engaging readers through writing sizzling starts.

Integrated Studies


Senior students have been learning about ways to stay safe and healthy, including how to stay safe online. In our Biological Sciences unit, students have been exploring the life cycle of gum trees. We have investigated what plants need to survive, why they produce fruit, and the importance of bees in the pollination of flowers.

Physical Education

This week in Physical Education students have been perfecting their throwing and catching skills, with catching skills, with a particular focus on the overarm throw. Students demonstrated their skills in games 'Skittle ball' and 'Dodge ball'.

Numeracy

Over the past two weeks in SEP and SDM we have been extending our understandings of number patterns, building strong foundations in numeracy, including using decimals and fractions. Students have also collected and represented data through tally charts, bar charts and picture graphs.







Visual Art

This week in Visual Art students continued work on their silhouette art. Perfecting their colour blending for the background and cutting out house and tree shapes to create the silhouette.
